What's The Difference?

ONLINE TRAINING


Online training is typically offered asynchronously. This means you sign up and can go through the material on your own schedule, within a certain time frame. You will have modules and an exam to complete. Pro: Flexibility. Con: Lack of interaction with instructor.

VIRTUAL TRAINING


Virtual Training is offered with a live instructor via an online platform like zoom. The instructor will typically provide information through lecture and a video. They will also evaluate a demonstration of the flagging procedure by you, and administer the exam. You will need access to a device with a camera and microphone for virtual training. Pro: Cost savings vs In-Person(no travel time/expenses). Con: Occasional technical difficulties.

IN-PERSON TRAINING

In-person training is the traditional model. An instructor in a classroom with the students. The instructor will typically provide information through lecture and a video. They will also evaluate a demonstration of the flagging procedures by you and administer the exam. Pro: The best interaction for students. Con: Costs more than other models.



Virtual and In-Person Training



Both virtual and In-person offer

an opportunity for students to ask questions and make comments during the class.

MANY STATES ACCEPT VIRTUAL TRAINING.

For example, in Pennsylvania the virtual acceptance expires on December 31, 2021, and Illinois will accept virtual training for Traffic Control classes but not for Flagger Certification.


